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Indo-European verbal roots and their relation between Sanskrit and Croatian language

Indo-European language family is the most widespread and therefore most researched group of languages. Slavic languages are one of the most spoken subgroups of Indo-European languages. It would appear that the Sanskrit language antiquity is partially preserved in Slavic verbs, which are remnants of Sanskrit verbs. This paper deals with phonological and morphological changes in each of the selected verbs of Sanskrit descent and their reflection on the most commonly used Croatian verbs. This paper will also examine a smaller number of such verbs and show the similarities between Sanskrit and Croatian.
